Who are you in Vaughan?

The Agricultural Period Settlers were drawn to Vaughan for the land. Hunting and fishing augmented grain and vegetable crops grown in its rich soil.

So, who are you?

Are you indigenous? If so, you presently make up 1% of Vaughan's population. However, you made the "Carrying Place Trail" known to help the French fur traders. You even farmed, which allowed you to stay relatively stationary.

Are you Pennsylvanian German or Franco-American immigrants who settled in Vaughan in the first half of the 19th century?

You could be more likely descended from British immigrants who flowed to this area around this same time, involved in farming and/or milling.

As a result of these waves, Vaughan's population increased from 54 people in 1800 to 4,300 people in 1840.


